Prior to 1st term enrollment, see Program Manager to determine readiness for the PACE or appropriate placement in ASL courses to prepare for the PACE. Life experience, previous ASL coursework in high school, college or a combination of these are recommended prior to taking the PACE. Students with no life experience or previous ASL coursework are recommended to complete ASL 1, 2 and 3 prior to taking the PACE (these courses satisfy credits in the A.A. elective category).

- **ENC 1101 - English Composition (Credit Hours: 3) - Prerequisites:** Satisfactory score on placement test (for non-exempt students only). See program note 1*.
- **Choose 1 Mathematics.** See program note 2*.
- **Choose 1 Social and Behavioral Science.** See program note 2*.
- **ASL 2510 – Deaf Culture (Credit Hours: 3) - Prerequisites:** None.
- **ENC 1102 - Writing About Texts (Credit Hours: 3) - Prerequisites:** ENC 1101 or ENC 1101C with a grade of “C” or better.
- **Choose 1 Mathematics.** See program note 2*.
- **Choose 1 Humanities.** See program note 2*.
- **SPC 2608 - Fundamentals of Public Speaking (Credit Hours: 3) - Prerequisites:** ENC 1101 or ENC 1101C with a grade of “C” or better.

***Note:** This program has a 2+2 articulation agreement with the University of North Florida’s B.S. degree in ASL/English Interpreting, which requires an additional 15-17 general education credits. Please speak with the Program Manager for additional information.
To pursue national certification as a sign language interpreter, candidates must complete a bachelor’s degree or its equivalent.*

Professional Courses:

- Students are admitted into the program during the “**fall term only**” with satisfactory entrance requirements.
- The program is designed to be cohort based with lock-step sequencing as identified on page 1; however part-time, enrollment is possible. Please speak with the Program Manager for information about alternative course sequencing.
- **INT prefix courses are only offered once per year.** If the sequence is missed, students will have to wait until the following year to take the course.
- Any ASL prefix course can be taken prior to admittance into program and will count towards electives for the Associate of Arts degree with the exception of ASL 2212. Additionally, ASL 1140, ASL 1150 and ASL 1130 are offered to prepare students for the entrance exam and can count towards electives for the Associate of Arts degree.

CAREER OPTIONS

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of interpreters and translators is expected to grow 46 percent from 2012 to 2022. Educational and community interpreting at the apprentice level are available in a variety of settings. Completion of a bachelor’s degree and national certification allows for access to larger range of work settings.

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
